



General Warnings

- Loading ramps are intended only for transporting vehicles onto/off a transport vehicle.
- Ramps are designed for handling at low and smooth speeds of up to 3 km/h.
- The weight of the transported vehicle must not exceed the maximum load capacity specified in the product description.
- The loading surface must not be higher than 80 cm.
- Do not manipulate the ramp or the transported vehicle under the influence of alcohol or other addictive substances.
- Failure to follow these instructions may result in damage to property (the transported vehicle, ramp, or transport vehicle) or injury to persons.

Instructions for Use in the Unfolded State

- If the ramp is foldable, visually check the hinge pin before use. The pin must be tightened and secure.
- Place the braked vehicle with the loading surface on a flat and solid surface.
- Place the ramps against the loading surface so that the lugs are in maximum contact with the loading surface.
- Ramps must not be used for loading onto a higher surface than the stated maximum height of 80 cm.
- If using multiple ramps, place them on the loading surface side by side at a distance corresponding to the track width of the vehicle.
- Make sure all parts of the ramp are securely resting on the edge of the loading surface.
- Drive the transported vehicle up the ramp at low speed (max. 3 km/h) and a constant speed, in a straight line, over the full width of the ramp, without any lateral movement.
- Always control the entire process from a safe distance.
- If necessary, secure the transported vehicle with brakes to ensure absolute smooth motion on the ramp/ramps.
- Never jump, run, or stand on the ramps.
- Never load the vehicle with the ramp positioned loosely or unevenly.
- Make sure the ramp is not slipping or moving during vehicle transport up the ramp.
- Ensure the load is centered and evenly distributed across the transport vehicle.
- The vehicle should always move in a straight line – never drive diagonally or sideways up the ramp.
- The ramp is not suitable for tracked vehicles or ATVs (ATV, UTV, SBS) and wheeled garden machinery.
- The ramp/ramps are not suitable for loading skid-steer or joystick-controlled vehicles where smooth movement cannot be ensured.
